CONFERENCE: XXI Geometrical Seminar

June 26 - July 2, 2022, Belgrade, Serbia

This is the 21th meeting of the Geometrical Seminar (GS XXI) which was planned to take place in 2020. (August 30 – September 5) in Belgrade, and which was postponed twice due to coronavirus (covid-19) pandemic. This time we are planning to organize the conference in both regimes: in person and online. We prefer to organize the conference in person, and this was the main reason for earlier postponements of the conference. Unfortunately, this pandemic has been going on for almost two years, and we decided to hold GS XXI this year because the previous GS XX was held four years ago. We hope that the pandemic situation in the world will be much better at the end of June than it is now, and we hope to meet participants in Belgrade.
