CONFERENCE: XXI Geometrical Seminar

August 30 – September 5, 2020, Belgrade, Serbia

This is the 21th meeting of the Geometrical Seminar which started its activities during the eighties in the last century, under the name Yugoslav Geometrical Seminar. At the beginning, the seminar was of the national level. With great efforts meetings were organized even in the difficult period of the nineties, but, nevertheless, the level of meetings has raised, from 17th Geometrical Seminar, which took place in Zlatibor 2012 and had over 100 participants from more than 30 countries. The aim of these meetings is to bring together mathematicians and physicists interested in geometry and its applications, to give lectures on new results, exchange ideas, problems and conjectures.
